Resolve Conflict Peacefully

Personal relationships can suffer when conflict is not handled appropriately. Through our services, we can help you and those with whom you are in conflict reach a peaceful resolution and start the process of rebuilding trust:

- mediation
- conflict coaching
- restorative justice

Get Legal Help

Sometimes legal action is necessary to make you whole. We provide access to free legal assistance for problems resulting from your victimization, including:

- divorce, child custody and support
- eviction
- identity theft and credit repair
- elder abuse
- public benefits
